

Education and (post) pandemic emergency

- "The greatest educational emergency of our times". Savethe future, 2020.
- Agenerational opportunity to reimage education:
 - New type of profesionalities
 - New professional, research-based knowledge



Three interlocking processes in education:

- Shift in **education policy** to include a wider range of multisector actors, interorganizational networks and sources of influence
- Increasing participation of **private technology companies** in educational policy networks.
- Arise in **new types of "evidence" production**, including 'what works' centers and programs.



Defining Brokers

Mainfocus: To facilitate information spread between researchers and educational practitioners. (Neal,2015)

Brokers are defined as organizations engaged in bridging the research-practice gap and the dissemination of knowledge in education. (Nealet. al., 2019)



Defining Education Brokers

"Amediator who brokers ideas and relationships between people, organizations and sectors in order to create new syntheses that can be branded as new, rather than used, and marketed simultaneously to political parties, media networks, and the public". (Williamson, 2016)

'People who are located at the interface between the national and the European arena who translate'the **meaning** of national data into policy terms in the European developments in the national space". (Grek et. al., 2009)




Defining Edtech Brokers

- Edtech brokers draw on or produce "evidence" and "scientific evaluations", making it accessible and attractive for decision makers in schools.
- Brokers combine **services** related to hardware, software and training. Example: Signpost.

'Delivering hardware & cloud solutions (sales, leasing, delivery, software, service, support, imaging, labelling, technicians, replacement equipment, spare parts, etc) at competitive prices" (Singpost, 2021).





