- The main focus of the module is improving language skills: improving knowledge and ability to use grammatical structures; expansion of vocabulary and; improving confidence and fluency.
- However, the subject matter is driven by the interests and curiosity of the students themselves. In terms of content there is no single "right answer" and the subjects in the exams are developed during the course of the year.

- described and explained verbally and in writing political and societal ideas and events
- debate dand discussed a variety of complex topics
- presented your thoughts and ideas clearly in the form of a 15-minute presentation and argumentative texts
- read and understood topical texts concerning politics and current affairs
- made accurate notes as a basis for producing written summaries and criticism
- developed your listening skills using a variety of audio texts

METHODOLOGY TO ACHIEVE THESE AIMS YOU WILL:

- read and listen to relevant source material, make notes on them and debate their contents
- write an ongoing portfolio with which you will improve your writing
- take part in regular debates and discussions on current affairs
- explain, describe, analyze, summarize, agree, disagree, create logical outlines and conclusions, formulate coherent arguments
- draw on knowledge gained in other faculties
