Research Associate

(pay grade 13 TVöD; 29,25 hrs. per week).

The position is available as of July 1st, 2021. The employment contract is limited until December 31st, 2023.

The research group ERika (headed by Profes. Dres. Felfe, Jacobsen, Nestoriuc, Paetzel and Traub (HSU/UniBw H) in cooperation with the BfR) contributes to the scientific foundations of risk communication from the perspectives of behavioral economics and psychology. The focus of ERika is on the cost of (avoided) crises in terms of health and quality of life in health-related consumer protection.

Job Description

- You are supporting the research activities of Erika in an interdisciplinary team of three research assistants, and you are conducting theoretical, experimental and empirical studies regarding the cost of (avoided) crises.
- You are given the opportunity to write a doctoral thesis.
- Participation in summer schools and national and international conferences is actively promoted by ERika.
- There will be regular project meetings between BfR and HSU/UniBw H.

Job Specification

- You have successfully completed a scientific university education (university diploma, master, or state exam) in Psychology.
- You command of experience in the fields of Judgement and Decision Making (under Risk), Risk/Health Communication, Expectation Management with emphasis on Nocebo Effects, and/or Information Processing and Credibility.
- You have of good command of German and English.
- You work structured, creative, and independent.
- You are communicative and team-minded.

(Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). You will be classified in pay grade E 13 TVöD if you meet all the personal requirements and perform all the work assigned.
